

- Many recreation clubs and fitness classes, including a modern, spacious sports complex




Why choose the **English Language Academy** at the University of San Diego?

The English Language Academy is located on the beautiful campus of the University of San Diego (USD), renowned for its beauty and Spanish Renaissance- inspired architecture. Classes are taught by experienced and enthusiastic instructors. Programs include: Intensive English, Pathway (for students interested in attending USD), Customized Programs, Summer International Junior Program, Pronunciation of American English Program, and Accent Modification.

The ELA staff is committed to preparing students to succeed in the social and academic communities of the university, as well as in their lives outside the university. The friendly and dedicated staff is here to help students with academic planning, housing, assistance with obtaining an I-20, social activities, and participating in campus functions.

Mission Statement

The English Language Academy offers an intensive English Language proficiency program that helps to improve and strengthen the skills of non-native speakers so they can fulfill the academic requirements of a college or university.



Intensive English Language Program (IEP)

The IEP helps non-native English speakers develop their English language skills, as well as acquire cultural knowledge in order to achieve personal, professional, and academic goals. Offered through the University of San Diego's English Language Academy (ELA), the IEP maintains a rigorous course of study, with a focus on essential core skills and TOEFL preparation.

One of the key advantages in attending the ELA is the fact that students are placed in individual core skills. More specifically, using results from the placement test, students are placed in different levels for each skill area. The program offers:

- ► Highly qualified instructors with graduate degrees
- ➤ Skill-based student placement for dynamic learning
- ► Small classes (average 10-15 students)
- ▶ A rigorous, academic course of study to help students achieve personal, professional, or academic needs
- ► An opportunity to improve test scores on TOEFL and/or IELTS exams

Short Term Intensive English Program (IEP)

The ELA offers a shortened version of the Intensive English Program, with two 7 week sessions in the Fall and Spring, and two 5-week sessions during the Summer.

USD Undergraduate Pathway Program

The USD Pathway Program offers academically prepared international students the opportunity to become full-time, degree-seeking USD students through completion of an English language and college readiness curriculum. The program includes:

- ▶ Letter of Conditional Acceptance
- ▶ Intensive English language instruction (1-3 semesters - as determined by academic achievement)
- ► A personalized pathway to college admission
- ▶ An opportunity to improve TOEFL/IELTS test scores
- ► A Letter of Recommendation from a member of the English Language Academy

USD Graduate Pathway Program

The USD Graduate Pathway Program offers academically prepared international students the opportunity to become degree-seeking graduate students at the School of Leadership and Education Sciences (SOLES) through successful completion of an English language and graduate degree program readiness curriculum. Online College Prep Courses

Introduction to Graduate Writing

This course will provide international scholars with the knowledge and specific tools necessary to improve their English academic writing skills, as well as successfully navigate the process of creating a research paper.

Preparing for University in the U.S.

International students planning to attend colleges/universities in the U.S. can give themselves the advantage of learning about campus life and academic expectations ahead of time by taking this course.

TOEFL iBT TestPrep

This course helps international students reach the required TOEFL test score for admission into U.S. (and other) academic institutions.

IELTS Test Prep

This course helps international students reach the required IELTS test score for admission into US (and other) academic institutions.



Customized Programs

Customized programs are available to specific groups of individuals from non-English-speaking countries who wish to improve their English skills for personal, academic, or professional reasons. Below are some examples:

Professional Development for University Professors

Non-native English speaking professors learn ways to explain academic content clearly and effectively in English, including providing constructive feedback to students.

Professional Development for Primary & Secondary School Teachers

This program is built around group work, presentations and discussion, allowing participants to improve their English skills while learning about various teaching skills.

Business English for Managers and Administrators

Participants' improve their ability to comfortably navigate in an English-speaking business and/or academic environment. Emphasis is placed on professional Speaking and Writing skills.

Global Leadership Summer Program for Teens

Beginning early July, students 13-17 years of age have the unique opportunity to experience American college life by living on the safe, beautiful campus of USD in shared rooms with en-suite bathrooms, and provided 21 meals per week. They will attend project-driven English classes taught by USD instructors, and practice their conversational skills during field trips, sporting activities, and social events. The program features:

- ► Small class sizes with an average of 14 students
- ► Engaging project-driven curriculum including team presentations and debates, concerning real world issues
- ► Great activities and all-day excursions in sunny Southern California
- ▶Flexible start dates

Pronunciation of American English Program

The program is for non-native English speakers who wish to learn how to communicate more clearly and effectively in an American English-speaking environment. Learners will improve their speaking ability, as well as gain more confidence.

Accent Modification

The Accent Modification Program is customized and offers a flexible schedule for individuals who have high intermediate to advanced English language skills, but who need help with their accent/pronunciation.
